The BIG BANG got so many things right

The folly of attributing design to randomness

Since it is but a mindless, accidental, evolutionary process, it is amazing how many things the Big Bang got right. It mananged to create (oops, produce) conditions for life to exist on Planet Earth.

Earth is the only planet in our solar system that can sustain life as we know it. It has many unusual and unique conditions required before human life could exist. No doubt evolution is right in concluding that human life exists by chance, not design.

Consider the wonder of Big Bang!

THE EARTH IS THE RIGHT DISTANCE FROM THE SUN¹

We are just the right distance from the sun so that we get the right amount of heat to sustain life. Energy is needed to fuel chemical reactions (metabolism).

Ten percent closer, too hot; ten percent farther, too cold. Planets from Mars to

Neptune are too cold to support life. Though the moon is relatively close to earth, its surface temperature varies each fifteen lunar days from a high of 214 degrees Fahrenheit above zero, to a low of 243 degrees Fahrenheit below zero.

THE EARTH'S ROTATION IS THE RIGHT SPEED

The earth rotates eastward once every 24 hours. It rotates counter clockwise (from perspective of the North Star). If the earth's rotation were 1/10 its pres-ent rate, the length of days and nights would increase ten times. Vegetation would burn up during the long days; if not, the low night temperatures would kill any plant life that survived the day.

THE EARTH IS THE RIGHT SIZE

The radius of the earth is 3963 miles at the equator. Its circumference is nearly



25,000 miles. Its surface is 197 million square miles. This produces a gravitational force of 15 pounds per square inch.

If the earth were the size of the moon, its gravity would only be 1/6 its present force and unable to hold either atmosphere or water. If its diameter were doubled, the force of gravity would be doubled, and the atmosphere would be compressed. If the earth were increased to the size of the sun, while retaining its density, gravity would increase 150 times. This would increase atmospheric pressure to over a ton per square inch. Life would be virtually impossible under such conditions. It is good that the Big Bang got it right.

EARTH HAS BOTH WATER AND CARBON

Water and carbon are required for life. Carbon is a necessary building block for complex organic molecules. Water is necessary for many chemical reactions. If the earth were once part of the sun, why didn't the water evaporate? How did the Big Bang pull that off? Impressive.

EARTH'S CRUST IS THE RIGHT THICKNESS

The earth's outer layer is three to five miles thick under the oceans and 25 or more miles thick under the continents. If the earth's crust were only ten feet thicker, the metallic elements in the crust would combine with the free oxygen in the atmosphere, ruling out the possibility of animal life. If the oceans were merely a few feet deeper, they would absorb so much carbon dioxide from the air that plants could not exist. Less than twenty feet tolerance on twenty miles? Amazing!

EARTH'S MOON IS THE RIGHT DISTANCE AWAY

The moon is on average about 239,000 miles from earth. Its gravitational pull creates the oceans' tides, which, among other things, scrub its beaches twice daily. If the moon were only 50,000 miles away, tides would submerge the continents twice a day. The Big Bang thought ahead and got it right the first time.

EARTH'S ATMOSPHERE IS THE RIGHT THICKNESS AND DENSITY

Atmosphere protects life by absorbing ultraviolet solar radiation, warming the surface through heat retention (greenhouse effect), creating pressure to keep water on the surface, and reducing temperature extremes between day and night.³

The density and thickness of the earth's atmosphere serves as a protective blanket to shield it from deadly radiation. If radiation reached the earth, human life could not exist. UV light can damage or break complex molecules, causing mutations. Our atmosphere is just dense enough to protect the earth from the twenty million meteors that enter it daily. These meteors, traveling at speeds of about thirty miles per second, would endanger all life on earth's surface. The Big Bang thought of everything!

THE COMPOSITION OF THE EARTH'S ATMOSPHERE IS PERFECT TO SUSTAIN LIFE

Dry air is about 78 parts nitrogen, 21 parts oxygen, 0.93% argon, 0.04% carbon diox-



ide, and small amounts of other gases.

Too much nitrogen would slow down all functions of the body so that death would result. Too much oxygen would increase the body's functions to a pace that life could not be sustained long term. It is highly unlikely that this mixture could have developed accidently since most accidents involving chemicals result in explosions. This is especially true of nitrogen, which is the basic ingredient in explosives. Thankfully, the Big Bang knew about explosions and was able to avoid this danger.

THE TILT OF THE EARTH IS RIGHT

The earth is tilted on its axis 23 1/2 degrees. This tilting, plus the revolution around the sun, creates earth's seasons. In most places on earth, this gives a healthy balance of time—spring/summer to raise necessary food, and fall/winter for the soil to lie idle, soak up moisture, and increase in fertility.

We have much for which to thank the Big Bang.

Or, maybe, "In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth" (Genesis 1:1), and, "The heavens declare the glory

of God; and the firmament shows His handiwork" (Psalm 19:1).

Marriage exists on three planes.

The first is the physical plane and is fulfilled in the sexual relationship. The second plane is the mental or psychological relationship and relates to the companionship/ friendship aspect of marriage. The third plane is the spiritual relationship and is enjoyed when Christians marry Christians.

Many marriages never get beyond the first level—and they do not last long. Elaine Walster, psychology and sociology professor at the University of Wisconsin, found that for most couples, intense passion lasts from six months to about two-and-a-half years. If this type of love is the only mortar holding the marriage together, trouble looms ahead.

When husbands or wives have only the second kind of love, they feel that an obligation exists, so they try to keep the marriage together because of duty. Since they have a license and a marriage certificate, they owe each other something (the attitude we have toward a family reunion—"I feel obligated to go"). They go through the motions, but there is no warmth.

Real love is binding, but it binds with the cords of voluntary service (Exodus 21:5–6). Robert Burton said, "No cord or cable can draw so forcibly, or bind so fast, as love can do with a single thread" (brainyquote.com/quotes/robert_burton_164716).

When a husband has only the second love, he and his wife may have fun together. This love depends on worth and admiration. If more worth and admiration arises in somebody else, then he may change wives as he does golfing partners. If it is a part of the whole of his love, it can add a great dimension to marriage.

Ideally, when *eros* lessons, *philia* can reinforce it, even enhance it. When a husband loves his wife with the deepest love, it is not based on good looks nor legal backing nor a flawless personality. It is based on no assignable causes, as God's love for people is not understandable.

"Husbands, love your wives, even as Christ also loved the church" (Ephesians 5:25). God could have said, "Husbands, *eros* your wives" or, "Husbands, *philia* your wives," but He did not.

God used the word *agape*. This word has to do with looking out for the other person's highest good. God's way to successful marriage focuses on what husbands and wives put into it, not on what they can get out of it. When you have all three, you can have a wonderful marriage.—Anonymous

Where Is the Headquarters of Your Church?

Have you been asked, "Where is the head of the church to which you belong?"

The only right answer is "in heaven." If a person belongs to a church that has headquarters on earth somewhere, whether Indianapolis, Nashville, St. Louis, Philadelphia, Rome, or some other city, he belongs to the wrong church, for the right church has its headquarters higher up than that.

Christ resides in heaven, seated at the God's right hand, and He is the only Head of the church (Colossians 1:18). Colossians was written thirty years after Christ ascended to heaven. He left no vicar here on earth. Christ is King in the kingdom of heaven, and is head of the church.

He is its founder, for He said, "On this rock I will build My church" (Matthew 16:18). He is its director, guiding it in all its ways. He is the door of the church (John 10:9), and He is the chief cornerstone (Ephesians 2:20). Belief in Christ's divinity is the creed of the church.

There are many metaphors used in Scripture to describe the church. It is called a family, a kingdom, a vineyard, a flock, a building, and a bride. But the most profound metaphor—one having no Old Testament equivalent—is that of a body.

The church is a body, and Christ is the head of the body. This concept is not used in the sense of the head of a company, but rather looks at the church as a living organism, inseparably tied together by the living Christ.

He is the head of the body, the church; not only a head of government and direction, as the king is the head of the state and has right to prescribe laws, but a head of vital influence, as the head in the natural body.

Christ is preeminent in His church (Ephesians 1:1–3; 5:23; Acts 2:36). The headquarters of the church are where the head is "quartered."—Oran Rhodes

Prominence?

Christians are mainly divisible into three classes—those who give Christ place, those who give Him prominence, and those who give Him preeminence.

- To those who give Him place, He is paid lip service, but that is all.
- · To those who give Him prominence, Christ is a prominent figure among others, one to whom deference is paid, but not one obeyed as Lord of all. These make money, pleasure, ambition, or success the preeminent thing in life, and devote to it their strength, thought, and energy.
- Those who give Him preeminence make Him the ruler of their lives.

Jesus Christ is not only eminent, but preeminent. He claimed for Himself:

- "Which of you convicts Me of sin?" (John 8:46).
- "I am the light of the world. He who follows Me shall not walk in darkness, but have the light of life" (John 8:12).
- "I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in Me, though he may die, he shall live" (John 11:25).
- "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me" (John 14:6).
- "I am the bread of life" (John 6:48).
- · "Come to Me, all you who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest" (Matthew 11:28).
- "If anyone thirsts, let him come to Me and drink" (John 7:37). —Anonymous

Does GodSend People to Hell?

God sent His Son so people would not have to go to hell (1 Timothy 2:4; 2 Peter 3:9; Ezekiel 33:11).

The Bible says, "God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life. For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world through Him might be saved. He who believes in Him is not condemned; but he who does not believe is condemned already, because he has not believed. . . . This is the condemnation, that the light has come into the world, and men loved darkness rather than light, because their deeds were evil" (John 3:16–19). This passage teaches three things:

- God loves the world and has done everything He can to save it (3:16–17).
- God lets each person choose his beliefs (light/darkness). A person's actions reflect his or her choice (3:18). The one who chooses evil prefers to remain in darkness.
- Man's destiny follows his decision. Light symbolizes good and heaven. Darkness symbolizes evil and hell.

Ultimately, we live with the consequences of our choices. C. S. Lewis put it this way: "Sin is man's saying to God throughout his life, 'Go away and leave me alone.'" Hell is God finally saying to man, 'You may have your wish."—Anonymous
